

1. What vacation or big trip (either as a child or an adult) did you enjoy the most?
2. Who is the most amazing, awe-inspiring person, you have ever met?
3. What's one thing from Sunday's message that you hope we talk about as a group?
4. How do you think most people who don't identify themselves as Christians describe Christians? What 'signs' (words) do they use to identify Christians?
5. Read the text for this series, Acts 2:42-47, as a group. Discuss what you think is easiest to duplicate in the church of today and what is most challenging? Is it realistic? Why or why not?
6. Take a moment to think about a time in your life when you felt closest to God. Can you recall any habits or spiritual disciplines that you practiced that might have impacted how you felt? Would you be willing to share with the group?
7. Today, taking a cue from Acts 2:43, a lot was said about what kind of 'signs' we display as Christians and if there is any 'awe' factor about us. 2 Corinthians 5:20 says, "We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making an appeal through us..." What about these two verses jumps out to you?
8. Brainstorm together some practical ideas of ways that you can 'add value' (awe) to people that are in your circle of influence?
9. In order for us to be awe-inspiring ambassadors, we have to be inspired in our relationship with Christ. In order to do that the message today discussed to be aware of what is draining you and what fuels you.
 - A. Of the four things mentioned that drain you (unhealthy people & unkind critics, unbalanced schedule, unnecessary guilt, or underestimating your exposure), which one drains you the most? What is something you can do to help limit that drain on you?
 - B. Five supply lines to fuel were mentioned today (investing in your growth, the power of worship, unleashing the Bible, building great relationships, and paying attention to the right voice). Which one would you most like to apply to your life this week or you feel is most needed?

Read Acts 4:13. What conclusions can you make from this one verse?

EXTRA CREDIT: Memorize 2 Corinthians 5:20 this week and give thought to the impact your life can have on others.
